The majority of eggs consumed in New Zealand come from caged hens. This is a cruel and inhumane way to raise animals. The hens are packed into cages that are so small they cannot even turn around. They are often kept in the dark for long periods of time.

Cheap eggs are often produced using cruel methods. The hens are kept in cages that are so small they cannot even turn around. They are often kept in the dark for long periods of time.

Power to the consumer
The only way to ensure that the eggs you buy are produced using humane methods is to buy eggs from a producer who is certified as humane. Look for the SAFE logo on the egg carton.
